A Gender Champion Emerges in Chamwino

Joanitha Kahangwa, a widowed mother of five, is a respected entrepreneur and community leader in Wilunze village, Manchali Ward – Chamwino District Council. She runs a restaurant and catering business, enabling her to support her children and extended family. She also serves on the Manchali Secondary School Board and is a Gender Champion and influential local leader.

But Joanitha is somewhat exceptional in her village.

This is because she resides in a community where women are often excluded from decision-making and leadership roles. Poverty, limited resources, and gender-based violence are common challenges for women in the area. Many men oppose women's involvement in business, sometimes exploit jointly owned assets without women's consent, or drive them from their homes, leaving them without support. But change is underway.

Through the Tanzania Women Chamber of Commerce (TWCC) and UN Women's Joint Programme on Accelerating Rural Women's Economic Empowerment (JP RWEE), Joanitha has received training in gender equality and social inclusion. Using RESPECT and SASA tools, she now acts as a mentor to women and youth aspiring to start and grow their own businesses.

"I was able to understand how important it is to help my fellow women fight GBV and other forms of discrimination," says Joanitha. "I feel proud that I can raise awareness and people can understand what I am sharing with them. I have become a champion in my community and now I receive many cases and people even visit my home seeking my support."
